Rock/pop: Desmond Dekker. Fri. *Copérnico Nova Club*, Galileo 67 (Islas Filipinas). Adv tickets: 15 euros from Madrid Rock. Veteran 60's reggae star best-known for hit *Israelites* with backing group, The Aces.

Flamenco: Rancapino. Thurs. *Clamores*, Alburquerque 14 (Bilbao). 15 euros. Classic pure flamenco from this renowned singer.

Dance: Bobos. Fri, Sat & Sun, 9pm. *Sala Cuarta Pared*, *Sala Cuarta Paralelo*, Ercilla 17 (Embajadores). High energy modern dance from Madrid choreographer Elena Córdoba.

Arco '04. Until Mon only. Parque Ferial Juan Carlos I (Campo de las Naciones). Cutting-edge works exhibited by 274 galleries from 29 different countries at this major international contemporary art fair. Plus experimental art and contributions by several young artists.

Maestros... de la colección Edmond de Rothschild del Museo del Louvre. Fundación Juan March, Castelló 77 (Núñez de Balboa). Eighty-four masterpieces from the Rothschild collection in Paris' Le Louvre including works by Rembrandt and Van Dyck.

Rubens: La Historia de Aquiles. Museo del Prado, Pº del Prado (Banco de España). Focusing on artistic role of Flemish artist, Rubens, in the creation of eight tapestries depicting the life of legendary Greek hero, Achilles.


Museo Reina Sofía. Santa Isabel 52 (Atocha). Current exhibitions include 20th century painter André Masson and German photo-montage pioneer Hannah Höch.

Museo Thyssen-Bornemisza. Pº del Prado 8 (Banco de España). Superb permanent collection of works from 13th century to the present-day.

Carteles de la Guerra Civil Española. Círculo de Bellas Artes, Marqués de Casa Riera 2 (Banco de España). Selection from socialist archives of 300 posters by Republican artists from the Spanish Civil War.

Revolving Doors. Fundación Telefónica, Fuencarral 3 (Gran Vía). International contemporary artists explore ambiguity between public/private spaces.

Art in the open

Catch the latest in "public art" in the *Madrid Abierto*, or Open Madrid, project. Main "exhibits" include *House-Madrid*, the simultaneous building and deconstruction of a house in Recoletos as choreography; the anti-noise pollution *Silent*, a huge sheet of transparent plastic in Castellana; and *Sans Façon*, where mirrors cover the pillars of a water tower.
